Dunning Doctoral Tutorial (JHD-DT)** and the **9th Danny Van Den Bulcke Doctoral Symposium (DVDB-DS)** – both targeted towards International Business doctoral students – are the pre-conference doctoral events that will be organized in conjunction with the **46th Annual Conference of the European International Business Academy (EIBA).**

The JHD-DT and the DVDB-DS will both take place online on **December 10, 2020 – Day 1** of the **EIBA 2020 Online Conference**.

ATTENTION: Please note that all accepted students participating in the doctoral events must be duly & fully registered for the EIBA 2020 online conference – this is a mandatory eligibility requirement.

34th JOHN H. DUNNING DOCTORAL TUTORIAL

The **Doctoral Tutorial** is a rigorous one-day workshop with the aim of attracting applications from doctoral students who, although not yet nearing completion of their thesis, are at an **advanced stage** and have already developed a clear idea of the theories, methods and data they will use (or are in the process of collecting), and of their intended research design. So, especially applications from doctoral candidates who are *mid-way through their thesis* will be considered. (*NOTE: PhD students in the early stages may be interested in applying for the Doctoral Symposium instead*). Students from schools that do not have established IB faculty research groups are particularly encouraged to apply. The Doctoral Tutorial gives the participants the opportunity to present and discuss their doctoral projects with a panel of world-class professors. Please note that attendance to the whole workshop is mandatory and participants are required to have their cameras on during the whole event.

9th DANNY VAN DEN BULCKE DOCTORAL SYMPOSIUM

The **Doctoral Symposium** is a half-day event with a joint opening plenary on a topical issue and small roundtable discussions. At each roundtable, 2-3 doctoral students are paired with 2-3 faculty members to discuss proposals in a friendly and informal setting. The symposium is specifically designed as a forum for doctoral students at an **early stage** of their dissertation process. In other words, these students are currently in the initial phases of defining their research design, including the selection of theories, methods as well as type and source of data.

(NOTE: PhD students at a more advanced stage may be interested in applying for the one-day John H. Dunning Doctoral Tutorial instead.)

The 2020 Doctoral Symposium will be co-chaired by **Rebecca PIEKKARI** and **Olga LAVRUSHEVA**. If you are interested in the EIBA 2020 Doctoral Events, please apply by September 14, 2020:

• a **three-page abstract** of your current doctoral research. This should be in Times Roman 12-point font, with single line spacing. There is a page limit of three (3) pages including any figures or tables, excluding references. (See the event websites for more details on how to structure your application.)

- your CV at the top of which should be included:
- the length of time, in months or years, that you have been working on your doctoral thesis;
- the name of your main thesis supervisor/advisor;
- the university or institution where your research is registered, and the department where you work.
